The Social Research and Planning Council (SRPC) is made up of community representatives who are dedicated to the collection, analysis and distribution of information relating to social trends and issues in Perth and Huron County. The intent of this research is to help residents, local government, social and human service agencies, and funding organizations to become educated on important social issues. The goal of this research will be to promote informed decisions on how the needs of those who are living in Perth and Huron County will be best served. As a Supported Partner of the United Way of Perth-Huron, the SRPC uses this research and information to address and support local community planning initiatives and to determine new avenues of research needed.

Project Description:

This report will investigate the Newcomer's experience in small and rural communities, specifically Perth and Huron Counties. As part of the investigation, this report will strive to reveal the barriers and obstacles New Comers face in Perth and Huron Counties, as well as determining what service gaps and employment barriers exist in this area.

Project goals and objectives:

Building on the existing preliminary data collection and an already developed report, The Newcomer Outreach and Needs Assessment (NONA), (made available upon request), the successful applicant will

continue to research the needs and barriers Newcomers face in Perth and Huron County. The final determination of content will be discussed between sub-committee members and the successful applicant.

Objectives for final report:

1) *Review existing data and elaborate on:*

Newcomer Perspective

- Cultural and linguistic differences
 - Transfer of educational qualifications
 - Employment readiness
 - Health and emotional well being
- Urban vs. rural experience
 - Reasons for migration
- Integration
 - Newcomers
 - Degree of integration and factors influencing that cultural identity (how they maintain identity, importance of maintaining cultural identity)

2) *Investigate and Identify:*

Community / Service Provider Perspective

- Cultural and linguistic differences
 - Education needs
 - Employment suitability
 - Health care needs
- Urban vs. rural experience
 - Reasons for migration to larger communities
- Service gaps
- Integration
 - Community (how they help newcomers integrate)
- Work force diversity
 - inclusion efforts
 - specific employer barriers
 - professional bridging

The Best practices already existing in other communities of similar size and population
Create recommendations for next steps

Bid:

Funding for the project is provided by Social Research & Planning Council. The budget for this project will include all expenses (excluding printing costs) and HST. This proposed budget must include research, writing, travel costs, and basic word processing report layout costs and is not to exceed \$20,000.

Requirements:

The successful applicant will demonstrate familiarity with and competency in: investigative research, collating and interpreting statistical data, formal and informal writing styles, knowledge of the community, and a demonstrated ability to deliver on the objectives of the project. They will also possess a demonstrated knowledge of Perth and Huron Counties, as well as, a solid understanding of both local and national statistical survey sources.

Deliverables:

- 1) A comprehensive report as outlined above provided in MS Word format
- 2) Two summary reports (1-2 pages), also in MS Word Format, presenting relevant information for
 - a) Employers
 - b) Community members
